Number of links that appear to be configurable by site (selected number will apply to all tabs.)
Links to be two lines maximum, anything longer will truncate nearest to full word (rounded down) with ellipsis.

Note, exact character count can not be detailed due to look & feel fluctuations, site property character count will have to be made on a case-by-case basis.
